VANTAGE POINT

Sunrise/Sunset Picnic on Signal Hill

Greet the dawn or toast the end of another spectacular day with a picnic laid out just for you at this vantage point over city and sea. All the details are taken care of: your basket includes scrumptious nibbles and your choice of beverage (including bubbly for special occasions), while your guide knows just where to stop for the best views and photo opportunities.



ICONIC SIGHTS

City Orientation Tour

Join this tour to see iconic sights, experience modern-day Capetonian life, and that of bygone eras on visits to historical treasures. You can look forward to summiting Table Mountain by aerial cable car; exploring the Castle of Good Hope; and sampling regional street food at the Eastern Food Bazar... to mention but a few exciting stops.

NATURAL BEAUTY

Table Mountain & Lions Head Guided Hike

Nowhere else in the world does an area of such natural beauty and diversity exist almost completely surrounded by a metropolitan area. With an extraordinary concentration and diversity of flora, variety of fauna and unique geology, the mountains are best explored on foot. Plus, the city and sea views from here are breathtaking.

Duration: 2 to 6 hours, route dependant



HISTORICAL WONDERS

Cape Peninsula Tour

Take in some of South Africa's most scenic countryside. Highlights include: panoramic seascapes from Chapman's Peak Drive; the natural and historical wonders of the Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve; Cape Point Ostrich Farm and Leather Shop; the African penguins of Boulders Beach; and the seaside villages of Kalk Bay and Simon's Town.

Duration: Full day



WINE COUNTRY TOWNS

Cape Winelands Tour

Visit the historical wine country towns of Stellenbosch and Franschhoek, and be treated to a minimum of three tastings at some of the Cape's most renowned estates. A cellar tour is offered on request. An eventful day ends with Vergenoegd Löw Wine Estate's Runner Duck Parade - the amusing late-afternoon ritual of the estate's natural pest-control team.

Duration: Full day





GET CLOSER BY BOAT

Whales & Wine Tour (June to November)

On the Whale Route, stop off along Kogelberg Nature Reserve's coast for some Southern Right whale land-based watching – among the world's most spectacular – or get closer by boat. Later, move on to the Wine Route and enjoy a minimum of two tastings in either the Elgin Valley or Hemel-en-Aarde Valley, both producing some very special wines.

Duration: Full day



LOVING ENVIRONMENT

Mfuleni Township Tour

MORE's Cape Cadogan Boutique Hotel and More Quarters Hotel, together with MORE Community Trust, assist Mfuleni's Injongo Educare Centre, which provides a loving environment of support and security for young and vulnerable children. Visit the centre and spend some time with the children, before taking a tour the township for an insight into life here.

Duration: Half day



TOWNSHIP LIFE

More Community Trust Homestays

Take you beyond seeing to experiencing authentic township life in Langa. It's one of South Africa's oldest townships, established in 1901 with a rich, turbulent history, turned vibrant present. The people here are known for their warmth and entrepreneurial spirit, and several households, with support from the trust, welcome you to tour, eat, and stay over with them.
